

John Welch Senior Stroke Play Trophy

Format: A stroke-play competition played off full handicap over 18 holes.

Tees: White

Entry requirements: Open to gentlemen who are 55 and over on the date of the competition. Entrants must have played in at least one qualifying competition in the previous 12 months. Qualifying competitions are Medals or Seniors Medals and 18 hole Stablefords or Seniors Stablefords.

Entry List: The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the competition date.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee: £2.00 per player, with all fees being donated to the Captain's nominated charity.

Prizes: Winner, runner up and 3rd place.

Jack Peacock Senior Trophy

Format: A stroke-play competition played off full handicap over 18 holes.

Tees: Yellow

Entry requirements: Open to gentlemen who are 55 and over on the date of the competition. Entrants must have played in at least one qualifying competition in the previous 12 months. Qualifying competitions are Medals or Seniors Medals and 18 hole Stablefords or Seniors Stablefords.

Entry List: The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the competition date.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee: £2

Prizes: Winner, runner up and 3rd place.

Seniors Captains Knockout

Format: A match play competition played off the competing player's full handicap over 18 holes. The lowest handicap player plays off scratch, the opponent receives the full handicap difference

Tees: White

Entry requirements: Open only to gentlemen members aged 55 or over on the closing date for the competition. Entrants must have played in at least one qualifying competition in the previous 12 months. Qualifying competitions are Medals or Seniors Medals and 18 hole Stablefords or Seniors Stablefords.

Entry List: The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the competition date.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee: £3.00 per player **to be paid prior to the draw for the competition being made** Payment to Hon Sec, Treasurer or any member of the Seniors Committee.

Prizes: Winner, runner up and losing semi finalists.

Special Notes: In the event of a halved match, the players will continue with sudden death continuing from the 10th tee. Handicap entitlement remains intact during sudden death play. It is the responsibility of both players to arrange their match. If both players cannot agree a match date, the Seniors Competition secretary will book a tee and advise both players of the time and date. Whichever player is on the tee at the appointed time will be declared the winner. If neither player is present a bye will be awarded to the next rounds opponent. If both players are late the 1st hole is deemed to be halved and the match would start on the 2nd hole. (Rule 6-3a/3).

A card must be kept for the match and signed by both players. It must be posted in the scorecard box for the attention of the Seniors Competition Secretary.

Players will play off their handicap as stated on the day of each match.

Seniors Stableford

Format: A stableford competition played off the full handicap of competing players over 18 holes.

Tees: Yellow

Entry requirements: Open to gentlemen who are 55 and over on the date of the competition.

Entry List: The entry list will be posted on the notice board 4 weeks before the competition date. It will normally be played on the fourth Tuesday of each month between April and September inclusive

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition

Entry Fee: £3.00 per player inclusive of £0.50p for the "2's" competition.

Prizes available to: 1st, 2nd & 3rd prize value is dependent upon the number of entrants for each competition.
The "2's" money will be split between the achievers If none monies carried over to next Stableford competition

Special Notes

The Seniors Competition secretary will block book tee times for the morning of the competition day. Special requests for later tee times must be made separately, directly to the Seniors Competition secretary.

Entrants are responsible for **LEGIBLY** writing their **OWN** name on the entry sheet

Seniors Medal

Format: A stroke play competition played off the full handicap of competing players over 18 holes in 2 divisions. Players with a playing handicap of 23 or less will play in division 1. All other players will play in division 2.

Tees: Division 1 – White. Division 2 – Yellow.

Entry requirements: Open to gentlemen who are 55 and over on the date of the competition.

Entry List: The entry list will be posted on the notice board 4 weeks before the competition date. It will normally be played on the second Tuesday of each month between April and September inclusive.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee: £3.00 per player inclusive of £0.50p for the “2’s” competition.

Prizes available to: 1st, 2nd & 3rd in both divisions Prize value is dependent upon the number of entrants for each competition, Split equally between both divisions

Division 1: Winner (Medal) Division 2: Winner (Medal)

The “2’s” money will be split between the achievers irrespective of division. If none it will be carried over to next Medal competition.

Special Notes:

The Seniors Competition secretary will block book tee times for the competition day.

Entrants are responsible for **LEGIBLY** writing their **OWN** name on the entry sheet.

Seniors Captain's Day

Format: To be announced on the entry sheet.

Tees: At the discretion of the Seniors Captain.

Entry requirements: As decided by the Seniors Captain and included on the entry sheet.

Entry List: The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the competition date.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee: As decided by the Captain

Prizes: As decided by the Captain.

Seniors Medal Winners Challenge Cup

Format: A stroke-play competition played off full handicap over 18 holes in 2 divisions. It will be played in October or November.

Tees: Division 1 – White. Division 2 - Yellow.

Entry requirements: Open to all winners of the Monthly Medal in each division from April to September of the current season. Players will play in the division in which they won their medal. Players who have won a medal in both divisions will play in division 1.

Entry List: Those members who qualify will be specified on a list that will be posted on the seniors' notice board with the result of the September Seniors medal.

Entry Fee: None.

Seniors Mixed Pairs

Challenge Trophy

Format: A mixed greensomes competition played off full handicap of the competing players over 18 holes. Maximum handicap of 28 for men and 36 for ladies. The handicap of each pair to be calculated as the sum of half of both of their handicaps.

Tees: Yellow and Red

Entry requirements: Open to ladies and gents who are aged 55 or over on the day of the competition. Pairs will be drawn from the entry lists of both gentlemen and ladies. If there are surplus gentlemen or ladies those with the highest handicaps will be ineligible working up the list in order of entry.

Entry List: The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the competition date.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee: £2.00 per player.

Prizes: Winners, runners up and 3rd place.

Seniors 3 Clubs and a Putter

Format: A stroke-play competition off full handicap using a maximum of 3 clubs and a putter over 18 holes.

Tees: Yellow

Entry requirements: Open to gentlemen who are 55 and over on the date of the competition.

Entry List: The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the competition date.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee: £3.00 per player.

Prizes: Winner, runner up and 3rd place.

Special Notes:

Players may only use the same 3 clubs and putter for the duration of the competition.

Format:

Entry:

An entry form must be completed and kept in the Winter Eclectic file kept in the club shop.

Each round played must be nominated **in advance** by "signing in" on the entry form,

On completion of each round the gross score on each 'improved' hole must be recorded against the date of play.

The scorecard for the round must be fully completed, signed by the player and marker and posted in box to be passed to the Competition Secretary.
