

Seniors 3 Clubs and a Putter

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A non-qualifying Stroke-play competition off full handicap over 18 holes using a maximum of 3 clubs and a putter which conforms to the requirements specified in the Rules of Golf. Players must use the same 3 clubs and putter for the duration of the competition.

Tees:

Yellow

Entry requirements:

Open to gentlemen members who are 55 and over on the date of the competition who have an active handicap.

Entry List:

The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the competition date.

Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee:

£3.00 per player.

Prizes: Trophy and Replica only to the Winner, to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times.

The Bill Todd Memorial Open

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A non-qualifying Stroke-play competition played off the full handicap of competing players over 18 holes.

Tees:

Yellow

Entry requirements:

Open to all amateur Gentlemen players. Any players without a CONGU Handicap will have a handicap assessed by the Seniors' Competition Secretary for the competition.

Entry List:

The entry list will be posted on the notice board 6 weeks before the competition date. Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date:

The entry list will be closed 9 days before the competition date.

Entry Fee:

None

Prizes:

The Bill Todd Trophy will be presented to the Winner, either on the day of the event, if the winner is a Visitor, or, together with a Replica, at the Seniors' Presentation Evening, as appropriate.

Special Notes: The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times.

Jack Peacock Seniors' Trophy

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A qualifying Stoke-play competition played off full handicap over 18 holes.

Tees:

Yellow

Entry requirements:

Open to gentlemen members who are 55 and over on the date of the competition. Entrants must have played in at least two qualifying competitions in the previous 12 months and have an active handicap.

Qualifying competitions are Seniors' Medals and Seniors' Stablefords.

Entry List:

The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the competition date.

Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee: £3. All proceeds will be allocated to the Seniors' Captain's Charity.

Prizes:

Jack Peacock Trophy and Replica Trophy to the Winner. Replica Trophies to the Runner Up and 3rd place, to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Over 70's Trophy to the highest placed competitor who is 70 years of age or over on the day of the competition, to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times

The Winners name will be added to the Roll of Honour Board for this event each year.

John Welch Senior's Stroke Play Trophy

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A qualifying Stroke-play competition played off full handicap over 18 holes.

Tees:

White

Entry requirements:

Open to gentlemen members who are 55 and over on the date of the competition Entrants must have played in at least two qualifying competitions in the previous 12 months and have an active handicap.

Qualifying competitions are Seniors Medals and Seniors' Stablefords.

Entry List:

The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the competition date.

Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date:

The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee:

£3.00 per player, with half the fees being donated to the Senior Captain's nominated charity. The remainder will be added to the Seniors' funds.

Prizes: Trophy and replica for the Winner, replicas for the Runner Up and 3rd placed competitor, to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times.

The Winners name will be added to the Roll of Honour Board for this event each year.

Seniors' 9 Hole Stableford

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A qualifying Stableford competition played off the full handicap of competing players over a CONGU approved 9 hole course. The handicap which applies will be calculated from the Handicap Conversion Chart which is on the web-site and a copy is filed at the back of the Master Handicap folder kept alongside the notice boards.

Tees:

Yellow

Entry requirements:

Open to gentlemen members who are 55 and over on the date of the competition who have an active handicap. Entrants with an inactive handicap may play in the competition to count towards reactivating their handicap, but will not be eligible for prizes.

Entry List:

The entry list will be posted on the notice board 4 weeks before the competition date. It will normally be played monthly on a Tuesday for four consecutive months from April to July inclusive.. Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date:

The entry list will be closed 9 days before the competition date.

Entry Fee: £3.00 per player inclusive of £0.50p for a "2's" competition.

Prizes: Vouchers to 1st, 2nd & 3rd placed competitors, to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening. Prize value is dependant upon the number of entrants for each competition. The "2's" money will be split between the achievers. If no twos are achieved the fund will be carried forward to the next 9 hole Stableford competition. If not won after all 9 hole Stablefords have been played the fund will be allocated equally between all the events of this format played during the year.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times.

All final putts must be holed, no given strokes allowed.

Seniors 18 Hole Stableford

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A qualifying Stableford competition played off the full handicap of competing players over 18 holes in one division.

Tees:

Yellow

Entry requirements:

Open to gentlemen members who are 55 and over on the date of the competition who have an active handicap. Entrants with an inactive handicap may play in the competition to count towards reactivating their handicap, but will not be eligible for prizes.

Entry List:

The entry list will be posted on the notice board 4 weeks before the competition date. It will normally be played monthly on a Tuesday between March and October inclusive. Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date:

The entry list will be closed 9 days before the competition date.

Entry Fee: £3.00 per player inclusive of £0.50p for a "2's" competition.

Prizes: Vouchers to 1st, 2nd & 3rd. Prize value is dependant upon the number of entrants for each competition, to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening. The "2's" money will be split between the achievers. If no twos are achieved the fund will be carried forward to the next 18 hole Stableford competition.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times. All final puts to be holed, no given strokes allowed.

Seniors' Captain's Day

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

At the discretion of the Seniors' Captain, but must include a team event and an individual players competition. This competition will be non qualifying for handicapping purposes.

Tees:

At the discretion of the Seniors' Captain.

Entry requirements:

Open to all gentlemen members over the age of 55, and, at the discretion of the Seniors' Captain, Ladies may be invited to take part.

Entry List: The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the competition date.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee:

At the discretion of the Seniors' Captain, but must include the cost of any catering provided. All other income will be allocated to the Seniors' Captain's Charity fund.

Prizes:

The Team event will be played for The Seniors' Captain's Mache which will be presented on the day of the event. Prizes for the event will be decided by the Seniors' Captain. The Winners of the Individual Players competition will be presented with the Bernie Minshall Trophy on the day of the event and again, with a Replica, at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Seniors Captain's Drive In

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A qualifying Stableford competition played off the full handicap of competing players over 18 holes or a format specified by the incoming Captain.

Tees:

Yellow or White at the Captain's discretion.

Entry requirements:

Open to gentlemen members who are 55 and over on the date of the competition who have an active handicap. Entrants with an inactive handicap may play in the competition to count towards reactivating their handicap, but will not be eligible for prizes.

Entry List:

The entry list will be posted on the notice board 4 weeks before the competition date. It will normally be played on a Tuesday in February and will be the first Seniors Competition of the season. Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date:

The entry list will be closed 9 days before the competition date.

Entry Fee: £3.00 per player. All proceeds to be allocated to the Seniors' Captain's Charity fund.

Prizes: Trophy to be presented to the Winner at the Seniors' Presentation Evening and Prizes to be presented by the Seniors' Captain, at his discretion, on the day of the event.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times.

If the format is a Stableford competition all final puts must be holed, no given strokes allowed.

Seniors' Captains Knockout Trophy

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format: A match play competition played off full handicap over 18 holes. The lowest handicap player to play off scratch, the opponent receives the full handicap difference. The competition will be played between 1st Apr and 31st Aug each year.

Tees: White

Entry requirements: Open only to gentlemen members aged 55 or over on the closing date for entry to the competition. Entrants must have played in at least one qualifying competition in the previous 12 months and have an active handicap at the commencement of the competition. Qualifying competitions are Seniors' Medals and 18 hole Seniors' Stablefords.

Entry List: The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the start of the competition. Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee: £3.00 per player **to be paid at least 9 days prior to the start of the competition.** Payment should be made to any member of the Seniors Committee who must issue a receipt from the official Seniors' receipt book.

Prizes: Trophy and Replica Trophy to Winner. Replica Trophies to Runner Up. The losing Semi Finalists will play off for third place and the winner will be presented with a Replica Trophy. All prizes will be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Special Notes: In the event of a halved match, play will continue with sudden death continuing from the 1st tee. Handicap entitlement remains intact during sudden death play.

It is the responsibility of both players to arrange their match. If both players cannot agree a match date, the Seniors' Competition Secretary will book a tee and advise both players of the time and date. If only one player is on the tee at the appointed time he will be declared the winner, unless the other player arrives within 5 minutes of the appointed time. In these circumstances the player arriving late will be deemed to have lost the first hole and play will start on the 2nd hole (Rule 6-3). If neither player is present within 5 minutes of the appointed time a bye will be awarded to the opponent in the next round.

A card must be kept for the match and signed by both players. It must be posted in the scorecard box, at the entrance to the Clubhouse, for the attention of the Seniors Competition Secretary.

Players will play off their current handicap on the day of the match.

Friendly Matches

Issue date 1st April 2011.

Format:

Teams will consist of up to 16 players in pairs and matches will be match play four ball better ball rounds over 18 holes. Dates of the matches will be agreed between the competing clubs. The precise number of players in each Friendly Match will be determined in conjunction with the opposing Club on each occasion.

Tees:

Yellow or as specified by the home club.

Entry Requirements:

The competition will be open to gentlemen members who are 55 and over on the dates when matches are played who have an active handicap.

Entry Selection:

Teams will be selected by a Selection Sub-Committee consisting of the Seniors' Captain, Seniors' Vice Captain and Seniors' Match Secretary.

The Sub-Committee will select from the list of entrants for each match taking into consideration when each entrant has last played in a Friendly match. They will rotate the teams to ensure that all entrants play as near as possible in turn, with the exception of the Captain and Vice Captain whose places will be reserved for every Friendly match. If the Captain and/or the Vice Captain are selected to play in an associated Offa's Dyke League match, their places in the Friendly will be allocated to other entrants.

Entry Fee:

All participating players will pay a fee set by the home club for the cost of a meal which will be provided after the match. This fee will be applicable whether or not the player stays for the meal. In addition the cost of buggies, if permitted and used, will be the responsibility of the players who hire them. Failure to pay these fees will result in the player(s) involved being ineligible for subsequent matches during the current season.

Dress Code:

All participating players will be expected to wear the type of clothes at the reception after the game which are consistent with the dress code specified by the Home Club.

Players in Friendly matches are encouraged to wear the Seniors' team shirt.

Failure to comply with the dress code will result in the player(s) involved being ineligible for subsequent matches during the current season.

Seniors K. J. Oliver Challenge Cup

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A qualifying Stableford competition played off the full handicap of competing players over 18 holes. It will be played approximately one week after the October Stableford has been completed.

Tees:

Yellow

Entry requirements:

Open to all Winners, Runners Up and Third Placed competitors in Seniors' Stableford competitions, either 9 or 18 hole, played from March to October of the current season.

Entry List:

Those members who qualify will be specified on a list which will be posted on the Seniors' notice board after the result of the September Stableford has been determined. Any additional players who qualify as a result of the October Stableford will be added to the list after the event has been played.

Entry Fee:

None.

Prizes:

Trophy and Replica for the Winner, Replica for the Runner Up, to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times.

All final puts to be holed, no given strokes allowed.

Seniors Medal Winners Challenge Cup

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A qualifying stroke-play competition played off full handicap over 18 holes in 2 divisions. It will be played in October.

Tees:

White both Divisions.

Entry requirements:

Open to all winners of the Seniors' Medal in each division from March to September of the current season. Players will play in the division in which they won their medal. Players who have won a medal in both divisions will play in their current division.

Entry List:

Those members who qualify will be specified on a list, which will be posted on the Seniors notice board after the result of the September Seniors' Medal has been determined.

Entry Fee:

None.

Prizes:

Trophies and replicas only to the Winners from both divisions, to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times. The name of the winner will be added to the honours board for this competition.

Seniors Medal

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A qualifying stroke-play competition played off the full handicap of competing players over 18 holes in 2 divisions.. The division split will be assessed by the Seniors Committee each year and posted on the notice board prior to the commencement of the competition.

Tees:

White in both divisions.

Entry requirements:

Open to gentlemen members who are 55 and over on the date of the competition who have an active handicap. Entrants with an inactive handicap may play in the competition to count towards reactivating their handicap, but will not be eligible for prizes.

Entry List:

The entry list will be posted on the notice board 4 weeks before the competition date. It will normally be played monthly on a Tuesday between March and September inclusive. Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date:

The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee:

£3.00 per player inclusive of £0.50p for a "2's" competition.

Prizes:

Medals to the Winners of Division 1 and Division 2. Vouchers to 1st, 2nd & 3rd in both divisions to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening. Prize value is dependent upon the number of entrants for each competition, split equally across both divisions.

The "2's" money will be split between the achievers irrespective of division. If no twos are achieved the fund will be carried forward to the next Seniors' Medal competition.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times.

Seniors' Mixed Pairs Challenge Trophy

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A non-qualifying mixed Greensomes competition played using the full handicaps of competing players over 18 holes. Maximum handicap of 28 for men and 36 for ladies. A single handicap for each pair will be calculated using the CONGU recommended Greensomes handicapping format.

Tees:

Yellow for Gentlemen and Red for Ladies.

Entry requirements:

Open to Ladies and Gentlemen members who are aged 55 or over on the day of the competition and have an active handicap.

Pairs will be drawn from the entry lists of both Gentlemen and Ladies. If there are surplus Gentlemen or Ladies those with the highest handicaps will be ineligible working up the list in handicap sequence in order of entry.

Entry List:

The entry list will be posted on the notice board at least 5 weeks prior to the competition date.

Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date:

The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee: £2.00 per player.

Prizes: Trophy and Replicas only for the Winners , to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times.

Offa's Dyke League

Issue date 1st April 2011.

Format:

The Offas Dyke League will consist initially of home and away team matches in competition with Welshpool, Church Stretton and Knighton Golf Clubs for the Offa's Dyke Trophy.

Teams will consist of 6 players in 3 pairs and matches will be match play four ball better ball rounds over 18 holes.

All matches must commence from the same tee and a maximum playing handicap of 24 will apply. Matches will be played using $\frac{3}{4}$ of the difference taken from the lowest handicapped player in each match.

Dates of the matches will be agreed between the competing clubs and the results will be passed to the administrating clubs Seniors Secretary. Points will be awarded for home wins (4), away wins (5) and ties (2). The winner will be the Club who have amassed the greatest number of points over all 6 matches played. Friendly matches will also be played at each league match. These matches will be played at tee times which follow immediately after the last Tee time of the league Match. The number of players in the Friendly Matches will be determined in conjunction with the opposing Club on each occasion.

A Presentation Day will be held after all League matches have been played on a date set by the Administrating Club at which 8 representatives from each Club will be invited to attend. The winning Club will be presented with the Offa's Dyke Shield.

Tees:

White

Entry Requirements:

The competition will be open to Gentlemen members who are 55 and over on the dates when matches are played who have an active handicap and who have played in at least two Seniors' Friendly or League matches during the preceding 12 months.

Entry Selection:

The team will be selected by a Selection Sub-Committee consisting of the Seniors' Captain, Seniors' Vice Captain, Seniors' Match Secretary with assistance from the Seniors' Handicap Secretary.

The Sub-Committee will select what they consider to be the best team from the list of entrants for each match taking current form in Club Competitions and Friendly Matches into account. Two reserves will also be selected who may play either in the team or, if not needed for this, in the Friendly match which will be held in conjunction with each of the league matches.

Entry Fee:

All participating players in either the Offa's Dyke league match, or the associated friendly match, will pay a fee set by the home club for the cost of a meal which will be provided after the match. This fee will be applicable whether or not the player stays for the meal. In addition the cost of buggies, if permitted and used, will be the responsibility of the players who hire them. Failure to pay these fees will result in the player(s) involved being ineligible for subsequent matches during the current season.

Dress Code:

All participating players in either the Offa's Dyke League match, or the associated Friendly match, will be expected to wear the type of clothes at the reception after the game which are consistent with the dress code specified by the Home Club.

Players in the Offa's Dyke league will be expected to wear the Seniors' team shirt and players in the Friendly matches are also encouraged to wear the team shirt.

Failure to comply with the dress code will result in the player(s) involved being ineligible for subsequent matches during the current season.

Seniors Open

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A qualifying Stableford competition played off the full handicap of competing players over 18 holes.

Tees:

Yellow for Gentlemen and Red for Ladies.

Entry requirements:

Open to Gentlemen and Ladies, who are 50 years of age and over on the date of the competition. This competition is "Open" to any amateur golfer who has an active handicap. Handicap certificates will be required for all "Visiting" players. There will be individual competitions for Gentlemen and Ladies.

Entry List:

The entry list will be posted on the notice board 12 weeks before the competition date. Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date:

The entry list will be closed 7 days before the competition date.

Entry Fee: To be set each year to take into account the cost of catering and the value of prizes purchased for the event. Any profits to be split equally between the Seniors and Ladies section's funds. All entry fees must be paid by the closing date of the competition. Entrants who are not members of Horsehay Village Golf Club must pay their entrance fee when submitting their application form.

Prizes:

Various to include for, Gentlemen's and Ladies events respectively, 1st, 2nd and 3rd places, nearest the pin in 1 and 2 strokes, longest drive and hidden holes. Prizes to be presented on the day of the Competition.

The Seniors' Open Trophy will be presented to the Winner of the Gentlemans competition, either on the day of the event, if the winner is a Visitor, or at the Seniors' Presentation Evening, as appropriate.

Special Notes: The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times.

All final puts must be holed, no given strokes allowed.

Seniors Sportsmans Trophy

Issue Date: 1st April 2011

Format:

A qualifying stroke play competition, played off the full handicap of competing players, over 18 holes to be played at the same time as the Seniors' Medal Winners Challenge Cup.

Tees:

White

Entry requirements:

Open to gentlemen who are 55 and over on the date of the competition who have an active handicap and have not won any Seniors Medal, Stableford or Trophy event during the current year. They must have entered at least 2 of these events during the current season.

Entry List:

Those members who qualify will be specified on a list which will be posted on the Seniors' notice board following the September Stableford. Any players who cease to qualify as a result of the October Medal or Stableford will be deleted from the list after these events have been played. Those members listed will be requested to tick their names on the list to indicate their intention to play in the event.

Closing Date:

The entry list will be closed after the October Stableford has been played.

Entry Fee:

None

Prizes:

The Sportsmans Trophy will be presented to the winner with a replica at the Seniors' Presentation Evening. The Runner Up will receive a Replica, to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times.

Seniors' Summer Eclectic Competition

Issue Date 1st April 2011

Format:

The competition will run from 1st March to 31st October each year.

Each Senior's eclectic score will be recorded automatically from scorecards submitted for all Seniors' events played during this period off white tees.

The competition will be run in two divisions. The division split will be assessed each year and posted on the notice board prior to the commencement of the competition.

Half of a members playing handicap will apply. The final results will be calculated based upon each player's handicap on 31st October in the current year.

The winners will be the players with the lowest total netted off recorded scores over the 18 holes in division 1 and division 2. In the event of a tie the prize for the division involved will be determined on count back.

Entry Requirements:

Open to all gentleman members aged 55 and over at the start of the Competition who have an active handicap.

Entry Fee:

None

Prizes:

Trophy and Replicas to Winners in each division, to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Issue date 1st April 2011

Format:

Points to be awarded for attaining the following gross scores in nominated events throughout the golfing year from 1st March to 31st October.

Gross Birdie – 5 Points

Gross Eagle – 10 Points

Gross Albatross – 15 Points

Points to be accumulated and leader board to be established as each qualifying competition is completed.

Tees:

Yellow or White as applicable to qualifying event.

Entry requirements:

Open to gentlemen who are 55 and over on the date of each of the qualifying competitions.

Entry List:

Entry will be automatic on entry to a qualifying event.

Closing Date:

On completion of the final qualifying event.

Entry Fee:

None.

Prizes:

Twitchers Trophy and replica to the Winner, to be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Seniors' Winter Eclectic Competition

Issue date 1st April 2011.

Format:

The competition will run from 1st November to the last day of February each year. Each player will play up to 6 qualifying rounds off yellow tees on either the Telford or Wrekin side or both and have a marker record the number of strokes played on each hole. A round played on one nine only will count as half a round and 18 hole rounds will count as one round. Nine hole rounds must be played an equal number of times on both sides of the course. The lowest recorded score on each hole will be kept as a record of each player eclectic performance.

Each round or half round to be played must be nominated on the forms provided in the Centre Shop prior to playing the round. Once a nomination has been entered it cannot be cancelled.

Qualifying rounds cannot be rounds played in another competition i.e. Monthly Medals, Stablefords or Trophy competitions and must be played with another Horsehay member to mark the card. All final puts must be holed, no given strokes allowed.

On completion of each round the scorecard for the round must be fully completed, signed by the Player and Marker and posted in the scorecards postbox at the entrance to the Clubhouse. The cards will be processed and a progress table, incorporating all rounds submitted by all Players, will be produced on a regular basis and posted on the Seniors' notice board.

Half of a members playing handicap will apply. The final results will be calculated based upon each player's handicap on 1st March.

The winners will be the players with the lowest nett total recorded scores over the 18 holes. In the event of a tie the prize will be determined by count back.

Entry Requirements:

The competition will be open to gentlemen members who are 55 and over on the date of commencement of the competition who have an active handicap.

Entry Fee:

A one off payment of £3.00 must be paid to any member of the Seniors Committee who must issue a receipt from the official Seniors' receipt book. Payment must be made not later than 31st October. No further entrants will be accepted after this date.

Prizes:

Winners will receive a Trophy, Replica and Vouchers. Runners up and Third Placed entrants will receive Vouchers. Vouchers will be awarded on a 50%, 30% and 20% split. These will all be presented at the Seniors' Presentation Evening.

Clive Rathbone Seniors v Gents Challenge Trophy

Issue date 14th July 2011.

Format:

This competition is a team event played between the Seniors Gents aged 55 years and over and the Gentlemen members aged between 18 years and 54 years on the day of the event.

Teams to consist of up to 16 players in pairs and matches will be match play four ball better ball rounds over 18 holes.

In each group the lowest handicap player will play off scratch, the other three will receive the full handicap difference. Matches won will be allocated 2 points to the winning team and matches halved one point to both teams. The team gaining the most points will be the winners.

Tees: White

Entry Requirements:

The competition will be open to Gentlemen members who have an active handicap on the day of the competition. Members aged 55 years and above on the day of the competition are eligible to play for the Seniors team, those aged 18 to 54 years must play for the Gentlemen's team. Seniors may elect to play for the Gentlemen's team, if they prefer, provided they have played in at least 3 "Club" events during the current year.

Entry List: The entry list will be posted on the Seniors and Club notice boards at least 5 weeks prior to the date of the competition. Entrants are responsible for **legibly** writing their **own** name on the entry sheet.

Closing Date: The entry list will be closed 9 days before the start of the competition.

Entry Fee: £5 per player to include the cost of refreshments after the competition has been played.

Prizes: The Clive Rathbone Seniors v Gents Challenge Trophy will be presented to the winning team on the day of the event and again at the appropriate Presentation Evening, dependent upon which team wins.

Special Notes:

The Seniors' Competition Secretary will block book the requisite number of tee times for the morning of the competition date. All play must take place within these tee times.

The Winning team's name will be added to the Roll of Honour Board for this event each year.
